Grants—Kayaks, Rafts and Climbing Wall



We have received a number of grants in 2008

Our most recent grant has allowed us to purchase a fleet of Mini Mystic Kayaks. These are great kayaks and capable of being used by beginners to advanced paddlers. As you can see from the above photo they work quite well!.

A 4.3 m raft has also been added to our fleet., This is a great addition as it can

hold a large number of students, cope with high river levels and can be used for groups with Special Needs. This will be made available to Search and Rescue if required.

In the last week or two we have also be awarded a significant Grant by the NZ Lottery Grants Board—Te Puna Tahua. This grant is for the construction of an Outside climbing / Abseil wall. This

will be approx 11m high and enable rock climbing and caving skills to be instructed on site. It is hoped that the wall will be constructed and being utilized by the end of the year.



Staff trip—Professional development

At the beginning of June we all traveled to the Central North Island for staff development in River Rescue and Alpine Skills.

We covered raft rescue skills and braved the frigid waters of the Tongarairo River. This was a really useful week for us to ensure that we are operating safely and up to date with current industry best practice.

We also explored the first Snow of the year on Mt Ruapehu. Skills were refined and knowledge shared in this Mountain Environment. Use of the Ice axe, crampons and belay systems were focused upon.

Later in June Nick ran a trip to the Kaituna river a serious grade 4+ river. This includes the highest commercially run Waterfall in NZ (7m).
